A 3-year home visitation model with highly-trained, supervised mentors.


The Parent-Child Assistance Program

(PCAP) began at the University of Washington in 1991. It was a federallyfunded research demonstration project testing a 3-year intensive advocacy/ mentor model with high-risk mothers and their children.

Today, PCAP is the Government of Alberta's selected program for the prevention of FASD.

Women don't get "kicked out".

"We work to support women regardless of the outcome of the pregnancy."



Client Enrollment

Primary

- ✓ Is pregnant or up to six months postpartum
- ✓ Abused alcohol/drugs during pregnancy
- ✓ Is not successfully engaged with community service providers

Secondary

- ✓ Has delivered a child diagnosed with an FASD
- ✓ Is still drinking
- ✓ Is in childbearing years

Primary Goal: Prevent future births of alcohol and/or drug exposed children









Mentors ...


- conduct an initial needs assessment and help determine and set personal goals
- develop a network; provide advocacy for other family members as needed
- address substance abuse
 - link to treatment options
 - provide support for treatment completion and recovery
 - help women develop relapse prevention strategies
- link with community service providers
- offer transportation for the client's important appointments
- work with the mother and the target child throughout custody placement changes





We envision a province where women with substance-use issues are well supported in their communities to have healthy pregnancies and healthy families.


Mission

Alberta PCAP Core Trainings




Trainers stand amongst successful participants of the Fall 2013 Central PCAP Core Training.

In 2012, the Alberta PCAP Council selected 9 people from Alberta to attend a "Train the Trainer" session in Seattle, Washington. This Training Team now provides annual PCAP Core Trainings and PCAP Refresher Trainings in North, Central, and Southern Alberta, which makes this essential training more affordable and accessible.

Outcomes Tracking Application

In early 2012, the Alberta PCAP Council implemented a data collection system for Alberta PCAP clients. The information will be used to provide feedback to programs and their clients, and to fulfill research and reporting needs.

The Data Oversight Committee has developed governance agreements and policies and procedures around data collection and distribution.

Council The Alberta PCAP collaborated with the ACCERT Lab from the University of Alberta on a qualitative research project to collect the experiences of PCAP Mentors in the workforce. Part of this effort resulted in the PCAP Quilt, which has travelled to national and international conferences for display, and was included in the Alberta FASD Cross-Ministry Committee's 2011/2012 Annual Report.

The training addressed leadership and support needs of supervisors including creating a productive and supportive workplace, research on different strategies for working with special populations, and maintaining fidelity to the PCAP model.




