



Activities and more!

- 5 City of Lethbridge buses, the Water Tower Digital Superboard and the U of L Curved Screen Digital Superboard will display our graphics beginning August 22nd and running until the end of September
- Business across the region that sell alcohol (pubs, restaurants, lounges, etc.) will be requested to use our coasters and display our decals and poster on their doors and mirrors in washrooms- in 2023, more than 80 businesses partnered with our Network for this event
- 1000 condoms in Network covers with our messaging on them, will be distributed to both Lethbridge Polytechnic and the University of Lethbridge for their Student Health Centres

- Promotional materials will be distributed at all community events that reflect the "Red Shoes Rock" theme e.g. key chains, removable tattoos (see attached graphics), stickers, etc.
- The Kainai Nation will distribute our posters throughout their offices of Blood Tribe Health, Community Services and Red Crow College
- The Network is partnering with the Piikani Nation to develop their activities for September 9th – the Network poster will be displayed at their Health Centre and I am speaking at an FASD-focused event they are hosting on September 9th
- Southern Alberta Community Living Association (SACLA) is displaying our Network poster and magnetic decals throughout their suite of offices

 they are also hosting a follow-up presentation on FASD for their staff in October


Red Shoes Rock
